

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Sagaponack on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2011, adopted the following Local Law:

**LOCAL LAW NO. 13 OF 2011**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING VILLAGE CODE  
SECTIONS 119-2, 119-5, 119-6 and 119-7  
OF CHAPTER 119, LIGHTING**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF SAGAPONACK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this local law is to update certain provisions of Village Code Chapter 119, Lighting, on the basis of its practical application since enactment in 2007.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF VILLAGE CODE § 119-2.

Village Code § 119-2 is amended by deletion of the following language:\*

[FULLY SHIELDED - A light fixture constructed, lamped, and installed in such a manner that all light emitted, either directly from the lamp or a diffusing element or indirectly by reflection or refraction from any part of the fixture, is projected below the light source.]

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\* Bracketed language is deleted. New language is underlined.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT OF VILLAGE CODE § 119-5.

Village Code § 119-5 is amended as follows:

§ 119-5. Standards for exterior lighting.

A. Lighting shall be designed, located, and lamped in order to prevent light pollution.

B. Lighting shall be designed, located, and lamped to meet the following requirements:

[(1) Fixtures shall be fully shielded as designed, installed, and operated.]

[(2)] 1. Fixtures shall not be located in, or aimed to illuminate, the public right-of-way, waterways, or public beaches.

[(3)] 2. The light sources of all exterior lighting shall not be higher than 60 vertical inches, except that:

(a) Not more than one tree per acre may be illuminated from a point no higher than 15 feet.

(b) One garage light may be mounted at a height no greater than 15 feet from grade.

(c) Dwelling-mounted entry lights may be mounted at a height not to exceed eight feet from the ground-floor level of such dwelling.

[(4)] 3. Fixtures shall not exceed [60] 40 watts or 550 lumens per fixture, as rated by the manufacturer, regardless of the number of light bulbs.

[(5)] 4. Exterior lighting not required by law shall be extinguished by 12:59 a.m.

[(6)] 5. Exterior lighting, regardless of the number of fixtures, shall not exceed a total of 500 watts or 6500 lumens per acre.

[(7)] 6. Motion-sensor-activated lighting shall be operable to shut off after five minutes and shall not be triggered by activity located off the property or from the roadway.

C. In no event shall fixtures be mounted in excess of a height which is greater than 1/3 the distance of the fixture to the nearest property line.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT OF VILLAGE CODE § 119-6(C).

Village Code § 119-6(C) is amended as follows:

C. Temporary lighting [in association with an approved mass gathering permit] shall comply with all provisions, exclusive of location, mounting height, and total wattage, and shall be extinguished no later than 12:59 a.m. on the date of [the] any approved event[.] authorizing its use.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT OF VILLAGE CODE § 119-7(H).

Village Code § 119-7(H) is amended as follows:

H. The following lamp and fixture types shall not be permitted:

(1) High-intensity discharge, including metal halide, and high-pressure and low-pressure sodium.

(2) Mercury vapor.

(3) Neon.

[(4) LED.]

[(5)] 4. Lamps rated higher than 3000 Kelvin in color.

SECTION 6. SEQRA.

This is a Type II action under 6 NYCRR § 617.5(c)(20) and (25).

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State as provided by law.
